



HEAD TEACHER (REL) HUMAN SOCIETY AND ITS ENVIRONMENT MR GLENN BENNETT

HSIE FACULTY IN FOCUS

HSIE (Human Society and Its Environment) is the study of human society and social relationships.

Here at Freshwater the HSIE faculty understand the importance for students to be able to connect what they learn in the classroom to what is happening in the real world. One of the most effective and powerful teaching tools to achieve this is to take students out on field trips.

The Year 12 Geography excursion to Pyrmont investigated the significance of Sydney as Australia's global city and to see firsthand the transformation of Pyrmont from a decayed manufacturing and industrial suburb into one of Australia's most densely populated and vibrant suburbs.

Year 11 Legal Studies attended the state courts at the Downing Centre in the CBD where they put their knowledge of the court jurisdiction and procedures into practice through observing a myriad of cases involving assaults, drug possession and traffic matters. It was a hugely successful excursion and inspired some students follow a career in law.

Year 12 Economics attended an economics conference in the city where they heard from experts in economics about issues such as the impact of Trump on global trade and how high housing prices and low wage growth could limit future economic growth. They were also treated to a lecture on the Federal budget by the Sydney Morning Herald's economics editor, Ross Gittins.

Also this year, Year 11 Ancient History classes participated in an excursion to the Ku-ring-gai National Park. With the guidance of Uncle Laurie Bimson, a Guringai Elder, the group viewed rock carvings and rock paintings and learnt about the meaning behind them. The students enjoyed learning about the ancient history of their local area.
